Beloved,

It is with joy and sadness that I write to let you know that I have been called to serve as an Oncology Chaplain at the Seidman Cancer Center, University Hospitals. Dr. Matthew Wooster, we have decided that my last Sunday at Plymouth will be June 5th, 2022.
