Dear Plymouth Church,

I am also writing to share with you that I have accepted the call to be the next Director of Music Ministries at Fairmount Presbyterian Church in Cleveland Heights. This decision was made after much prayer and discernment, especially given the proximity of our churches.

I am ready for this new opportunity to apply my gifts in a different context. And I feel that Plymouth will benefit from new and fresh musical leadership. There remains great potential at Plymouth for both art and music ministry. I will do my part to respect boundaries and to give space. I will, however, be cheering you on in spirit.

Sunday, June 25 will be my last day at Plymouth. Given the incredible celebration for my 25th anniversary, I do not desire, nor do I expect there to be any further celebration on my departure. A moment of release and blessing during the worship service will suffice.

Hymn singing has been the foundation of what we do each time we gather to worship. I leave you with this text by Jane Parker Huber which was sung on Plymouth's 100th anniversary, "Shape us as your congregations, called together, sent afar, so as people or as nations we can serve you where we are. O accept the praise we bring you, bless the work of human hands. Hear the hymns our voices sing you, echoing through years and lands."
