#### Pastor's Corner

Dear Plymouth Church,

Depending on when you read this, Plymouth Church may already have a new sign out in front of our church building. As I write this in late April, the spring sun is shining on the two new brick pillars that will support the new sign between them.

You might ask: why are we having a new sign installed?

Almost a year ago, I made these observations during a sermon on May 21:

Maybe you have noticed that our beloved church sign, which stands at the corner of the front lawn at the intersection of Coventry, Weymouth, and Drexmore roads, is falling apart. The wood has rotted, the structural integrity seems suspect. It does not reflect that Plymouth Church is home to a vibrant and energetic community. Instead, you might say that the unintended message of the sign is something like: 'here is a church built years ago that is not really keeping it together in the present.' That is not true, but it is an impression that someone might form by looking at the old sign. So we are getting ready to replace it with a new sign that lets people know: this is Plymouth Church, United Church of Christ, An Open & Affirming, and Just Peace Church. It will be a sign that has a sense of permanence. The subtext of the new sign might be 'trust us, we're here for the long haul. We're not falling apart.'

Now the new sign is almost here, ready to proclaim our presence. The sign is an act of faith. It is an investment in the ministries of this church for next year and for years to come, because we trust that we are called to share the generous and inclusive love of God, and we know that this healing work is needed.

Let's be honest – having a nice sign is not enough to invite our neighbors to the gifts of worship and community at Plymouth Church. I don't expect 200 new guests to show up for worship on the Sunday after the sign is installed. (Although it is fun to imagine that!)

The message of the sign is that Plymouth is a vibrant community of God's abundant love and healing grace, but we know the sign isn't enough.

So let's take it one step further:

What can you do in your life – and what can we do together – to let people know about the gifts we have to offer?

I'll see you in church.

#### From Dillon's Desk

#### May 19: A Supersized Sunday!

Dear friends,

As soon as you're finished reading this, I hope you begin gearing up for worship on Sunday, May 19, as we will have much to celebrate that day. It is both **Pentecost** and **Confirmation Day!** 



Our celebration of Pentecost commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the first followers of Jesus as depicted in the Acts of the Apostles and in our lives as well. The Holy Spirit is God at work in the world and in the Church. When we notice or feel God working in our lives and in our world - we are encountering the Holy Spirit. The Spirit inspired the prophets of the Bible to proclaim God's message to the world in their day and continues to inspire those who work to lead the world closer to God's vision for it today. We experience the Holy Spirit in our own lives whenever we are brought into love and harmony with God, with ourselves, with our neighbors, and with all creation.

The symbols of the Holy Spirit are the dove (which descended on Jesus when he was baptized in the Jordan River), holy fire (the burning bush, the tongues of flame in the Acts of the Apostles), and a mighty wind and the breath of God (which moved over the waters in the Creation story in

Genesis, and which was breathed out upon the apostles by Jesus). The liturgical color of Pentecost is **Red** - symbolizing the fire of the Spirit burning within us.

When we were thinking about which day our confirmands would be confirmed, it made perfect sense that it would be on Pentecost Sunday! Anders Beckman, Bohdan Chrobak, Catherine Cleminshaw, Luke Grube, Wesley Lewis, Sophia Morris, and Kyle Szalay have been on a journey of exploring their faith since this past August. These seven amazing youth are discerning how they feel called to be part of the Church. God has already given them the gifts of the Spirit, bestowed upon them throughout their lives up until this point, and through baptism, but they can take on a new life through confirmation, as a greater understanding of one's faith has been named and claimed.

I have seen new understandings and sparks of excitement about their faith come alive over the course of the past year. It is important to remember that this growing in and exploration of their faith will not stop when we lay hands on them and confirm them this month. We, as part of their faith community, make a promise to them in both their baptism and their confirmation that we are here to support them as they continue to explore what it means to be a Christian, and in turn, how they live out their faith in this world. It is a great duty that we are called to as the church, but also an immense honor, as these seven already bless our community in amazing ways.

Come to church on May 19 and **WEAR RED** as we celebrate the Spirit of God - leading us, guiding us, inspiring us to live lives of courageous faith and of love and harmony with God and the world around us, and blessing our confirmands as they enter a new chapter of their faithful journey!










#### Shaker Heights Hunger Center Volunteers




#### Wednesday, May 15 at 12:30pm Lunch Club In Fellowship Hall
